

St. Patrick

Today is one of the most well-known "saint days" in the church year, when many Americans become Irish at least for the day, and celebrate by wearing shamrock gear, eating corned beef and cabbage, or drinking green beer. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, was born into a Christian family in Britain around 390 and is remembered as a missionary to Irish clans and chieftains, notably erecting altars and churches over druid





Did You Know?

Fr. Tim serves The Episcopal Church in Western Louisiana in two official ways beyond his ministry at St. James: as committee chair of The Beloved Community, and as President of the Standing Committee.

The Beloved Community



The Episcopal Church's *Becoming Beloved Community* vision – presented by Presiding Bishop Michael Curry and our Church's key leaders in May 2017 – frames a path for Episcopalians to address both class and racial injustice and grow as a community of reconcilers, justice-makers, and healers. Because this is the work of spiritual formation, and not simply completing a training or implementing a set of programs, individuals and congregations are encourgaed to embrace the journey ahead as a long-term commitment of conversation and getting to know one another through our life stories and background.

Currently, Fr. Tim is meeting weekly on Monday nights with diocesan committee members, including parishioners Daniel Chapman and Joy Owensby, for open conversations and stories about our backgrounds and how we see class and race. One hope of the committee is to use a similar discussion format around the diocese that encourages open, and non-accusatory, conversations about how we look at the world.

Standing Committee

This committee, elected by diocesan convention, serves as Bishop Jake's council of advice. Half of its members are clerical, half lay. The Standing Committee is requested to give consent for all bishops elected in the Episcopal Church. It recommends persons for ordination. It gives the bishop advice and consent on the purchase, sale, or encumbrance of any property held by a congregation or the diocese. The Standing Committee also serves as the ecclesiastical authority in the absence of a bishop. (Which we are not worried about!)

You can help make a beautiful space all the more spectacular as we offer something for the worship of God.


