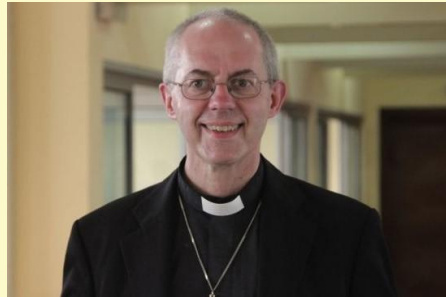

TRINITY REFLECTIONS

One of the most difficult to explain, and often misunderstood concepts in the Christian faith is the belief in a trinitarian God, one God with three aspects. Often characterized as the 'Father,' 'Son,' and 'Holy Spirit,' the Trinity represents God the Father/Creator, Jesus Christ the Son and Savior, and the Holy Spirit, or the creative, inspirational force at work in the world.



There are many metaphors for the Trinity, many ways of trying to conceptualize that which is almost beyond our grasp, but for Christians it is the way we interact with these three aspects that matter most. The Trinity provides structure to our prayers, our worship services, our lives....these three aspects of God in combination represent God to the world in general and to humans in particular.

In a sermon Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury, once described the concept of the Trinity as *community, perfect in love and acceptance and giving out, going out. We are to be like that in the church.*

Where there are Christians, people should know that the hungry will be fed, those who are hurting will be healed, those who are lonely will be loved, those who are in despair will be brought hope, those who are disruptive will be taught to do the right thing and to love their country and society.

In such a community the life of the Trinity is made visible, and in such a community we find our sure defense against all that life can throw at us.

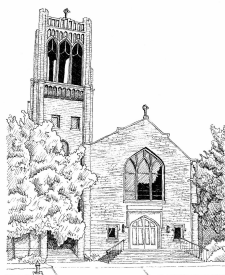
