His most recent nonfiction book is A Long, Long Way: Hollywood's Unfinished Journey from Racism to Reconciliation, is a lead title for Oxford University Press in 2020 and the basis for his Sunday morning Formation presentation. According to BBC Radio, Greg is "one of America's most important voices on religion and culture." Greg speaks and preaches widely throughout the Episcopal Church. He lives in Austin, Texas, with his wife, Jeanie, and their family.

## **Now Hiring - Church Sexton**

#### What is a Sexton, you ask?

The word sexton is of Old French origin (*sekesteyn*) and referred to the "person in charge of the sacred objects of a church." It was widely used in the Church of England to refer to a church officer or employee who would care for the church grounds - from ringing the church bells to digging graves in church cemeteries! This title is still used in some churches today, thanks to our Anglican heritage, to refer to the maintenance and/or custodial staff.

Help spread the word that Fr. Tim is actively seeking a part-time Sexton (up to 20 hours) for general custodial duties and preventative maintenance around the church campus. Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings are required, with other hours to be arranged with Fr. Tim. We have a great office team and work environment - and flexible hours! 
