Vacation Time


Fr. John, Donna and Taylor will be enjoying a family vacation for the next two weeks (May 15 - 28). We wish them a relaxing, pleasant trip!

Through story and song (and a few puppets), Evan takes us on a poignant, often humorous journey that spans continents, decades, and the generations. Ultimately "Shards" is the tory of finding home, finding homeland, and along the way learning a bit more about yourself.
