From Fr. John

This Sunday we transition from the season following the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, into what the Church calls "Ordinary Time." It is not the season of Pentecost. It is the season after Pentecost.

This season is called Ordinary Time, not because it is plain or unassuming, but rather because the weeks are numbered. "Ordinary" in this instance comes from the Latin ordo which is also the root for the word "order." From now until we get to the season of Advent (which precedes Christmas), we will be in Ordinary Time. This season is also referred to as the "long, green, growing season."

During Ordinary Time our church vestments are green, to represent this time of growth. As of Pentecost Sunday, we have made note of the empowerment of the Holy Spirit in our lives. That Spirit is now pushing us to "grow" in Christ and to "grow" the spread of the Gospel.

What the long growing season means for the people of St. James is dependent upon what the Holy Spirit is whispering to each of us. The readings for this Sunday reflect how God communicates with us, but also how much freedom we have been given, as followers of Jesus. The stories of Isaiah, St. Paul in Galatia, and Jesus with the Gerasene Demoniac, tell us that God is on the move. God never sits still. And now, through the amazing Holy Spirit, we have been empowered to get up and go with God, spreading the Gospel and doing God's work in a broken and hurting word.

If you are starting to feel the pull of the Spirit but just don't know what it is saying, come and see me. Let's talk about where God might be calling you to go. Likewise, if you feel that God is calling St. James to something, come and see me. Let's explore where this community might be headed.

God is on the move. Don't get left behind.

A two-day interactive workshop in suicide first aid, ASIST teaches participants to recognize when someone may have thoughts of suicide and work with them to create a plan that will support their immediate safety. 
