The COVID-19 pandemic changed a great many things about how churches handle worship. As we remember all too well, for a time the only way we could worship together was online. Congregations rushed to find a way to make that happen. Some did a better job than others, but most found a way to make "streaming worship services" work.

Every church that conducted worship services online found that they attracted a group of people through the online experience who would never have worshipped with them otherwise. And as in-person worship began to come back, church leaders wondered what would, or should happen to their online communities.

Now that virtually all churches have been meeting in-person for quite a while, The Episcopal Church and the Diocese of Western Louisiana have endorsed the idea that online worship should continue as an add-on to the "regular" services. And not only should online worship continue, it should increase, wherever possible. To that end, we have been working toward being able to live stream our Sunday Eucharist services.

This week we began installation of the audio/video equipment necessary to live stream our main Sunday morning service. It will take us a little while to get the hang of the equipment and to work out the inevitable bugs that will surface. But I'm hoping that we will be up and online by the end of July.

We will be using equipment and software that should be very user friendly, but we will need live humans to make everything work. If you are interested in helping with the behind-the-scenes operations needed to live stream, please let me know. Instruction will be available for those who would like to be involved.

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)

A two-day interactive workshop in suicide first aid, ASIST teaches participants to recognize when someone may have thoughts of suicide and work with them to create a plan that will support their immediate

safety. Although ASIST is widely used by healthcare providers, participants don't need any formal training to attend the workshop—anyone 16 or older can learn and use the ASIST model.
