#### From Fr. John

September is almost behind us and the Autumn season will (hopefully) bring cool weather soon. As we edge toward the season of Advent (beginning November 27<sup>th</sup>), we continue in the long, green, growing season after Pentecost.

As you may have noticed since my arrival here, I like to utilize the broad resources of our Book of Common Prayer. We have begun cycling through the Eucharistic prayers and the different versions of the Prayers of the People. For the next five weeks, we will be utilizing Form II of the Prayers and Eucharistic Prayer D.

I do not change things up on Sundays: to keep you on your toes; to confuse you; or least of all, to annoy you. I simply believe that the Book of Common Prayer provides for much more than opening to page 355, using Form III of the Prayers and Eucharistic Prayer A. Each of our forms provides us an opportunity to hear the words differently, and hopefully to be reached in a new and different way. While liturgical decisions are my responsibility, being guided by church canons, prayer book rubrics, and our Bishop; I am also informed by input from the Worship Committee. And I listen when you tell me what you like and what you don't.

Please do not ever hesitate to tell me what parts of the service you like and what parts you are not so enamored with. I cannot possibly make liturgical decisions that will satisfy every person, every week. But I do listen, and I still appreciate feedback

This is a wonderful worshipping community. I am proud and honored to lead worship here. Know that everything we do – even the things that we try, that might fail miserably – we do to the Glory of God, hopeful of deepening our relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, day by day.
