From Fr. John

Happy New Year.

This Friday, January 6th, is the Feast of the Epiphany. And Sunday, January 8th, we celebrate the Baptism of Our Lord. At the 10:30 service on Sunday, the Rt. Rev. Jacob W. Owensby, PhD, DD, Bishop of Western Louisiana, will be here for his annual visitation. He will celebrate, preach, and confirm/receive/reaffirm several members of our community.

The Epiphany and The Baptism of Our Lord — point to a very important tenet of our faith: Jesus has been revealed to us as both the Incarnation of God and the beloved Son of God. Our individual epiphanies of who God is go on throughout our lives. When we're children, we may have been told (and thus, had an epiphany) that God is the one who sees everything we do. Thereby scaring or putting pressure on us to be "good," even when no one is watching. But as we mature and move forward in our lives God is (hopefully) revealed to us in other, more mature ways.

What is the epiphany (revelation) of God that is most operative in your life today? Do you understand God to be a strict disciplinarian? Or perhaps God, as you understand God to be, is the judge, waiting for you to slip up in order to smite you, or at least cause some calamity in your life.

In the last year, you have heard enough of my sermons to understand that I believe the essence of God, as revealed to us in Jesus Christ, to be love. As we have all heard a thousand times, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." That is a statement of who the loving God is, and who that God recognizes us to be. And in case that was somehow confusing, the third chapter of John's Gospel goes on, in the next verse, to say this: "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

On Sunday, as a part of the service, we will all reaffirm our baptismal covenant. Pay attention when we get to the Bishop's questions for us. He will ask us if we will: proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ; seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving (our) neighbor as (ourselves); and if we will strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being. Our answer to these questions — the only true answer — is, "I will, with God's help." Come on Sunday and celebrate the Baptism of our Lord. Jesus will be in our midst. Come and meet him, he is in the face of everyone you will see. Then take your own epiphany of a loving God into the world, living out your baptismal vows.

The Peace of God and the joy of the season, be with you all. Fr. John+


