From Fr. John

Last year, at about this same time, I wrote to you regarding when one should call the Rector. It is a good reminder for folks who might not know when they can/should "bother" the Rector. Here is what I wrote last year:

In the life of every clergy person, an issue comes up occasionally concerning when and why someone should call their priest. Heartbreakingly, clergy sometimes find out about things after a parishioner has suffered some deep hurt and is now estranged from the church because they feel unsupported. So here is a — hopefully helpful — rule of thumb. If you are in a situation in which you think about calling the priest ... call. Do you have someone who has gone into the hospital, or a long-term care facility, or hospice? Call. Have you lost the relationship with someone close to you? Call. Are you in potential trouble in your marriage, or at work, or with your children? Call. I am here to help you, whenever and however I can. I probably will not be able to fix your problem. But I can commiserate with you. I can empathize. Most importantly, I can listen to you. And I can pray with you. Don't ever be ashamed to call. I may not have seen everything that there is to see, but I've come pretty close. It is not likely that you will shock me. I will not judge you. And what you say to me, stays with me and only me. So the rule is, if you need me, call me. And if you just want to visit? Call me.

In the last couple of weeks we have had several folks who needed what used to be called, Last Rites and is now referred to as Ministration at the Time of Death. Please call me if someone close to you needs that sort of pastoral care. I thank Fr. Jim Theus for being available recently when I was not. But no matter where I am or what is going on, rest assured that I will make certain that you have clergy presence when you tell me you need it.
