From Fr. John

We celebrate Trinity Sunday this weekend. For those who aren't familiar with this feast day, or otherwise have never paid attention to such things, this is the Sunday when we celebrate (or at least contemplate) the existence of a Holy Trinity, in which God is manifested as: God the Creator (Father); God the Redeemer (Son); and God the Sustainer (Holy Spirit).

Most priests I know try to pass the preaching for Trinity Sunday off to another priest (or deacon), because preaching on a doctrine (i.e. the doctrine of the Holy Trinity) is a difficult thing. It all comes out like teaching about an undivided entity that is three different elements, rather than preaching the Good News. But all of that is my problem, not yours.

St. Patrick is said to have tried to teach an Irishman about the Trinity by using a shamrock as an example. He said that there were three persons (Father, Son, Holy Spirit), but one God and three leaves but one shamrock.

It can all get pretty dry and esoteric, if we try to understand the details of it. But if we simply believe in the God about whom we speak in the Apostle's (and/or Nicene) Creed; and if we do our best to appreciate the world God (the Creator) gave us, while we try to love people the way Jesus (the Redeemer) did, relying on the power of the Holy Spirit (the Sustainer) to get the work done, all will be well. Not perfect, but well.
