## From Fr. John

I was emailing back and forth with Gary Delahoussaye today and the correspondence left me with a heavy heart. Gary let me know that the last Vestry meeting was the last one he would be attending. He, Julia, and Claire have now completed their move to Lafayette. I knew that it was coming. But now it is real. And while we know that the move is good for them, it is still hard.

It's always difficult to say goodbye to people with whom you have a relationship. It does not matter whether it is a job-related move, like the Delahoussaye/Callis move, or a separation because of problems between people, or even separation by death. No matter what the reason for being apart, the absence of someone we care about leaves a hole in our lives.

At the end of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus told the gathered disciples, "[R]emember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." I believe that the same is true of those with whom we have had relationships. They stay with us, in our memories, in our hearts, even to the end of the age.

As is true in so many situations, our Book of Common Prayer has a prayer for occasions such as this. Prayer 52, "For the Absent," on page 830, is written in the more antiquated language. I have reworded it. Let us pray for all those whom we miss.

O God, whose care for all of creation reaches to the ends of the earth: We humbly pray that you would graciously look upon and bless those whom we love, but who are now absent from us. Defend them from all dangers of soul and body; and grant that both they and we, drawing closer to you, may be bound together by your love, in the communion of your Holy Spirit, and in the never-ending fellowship of the saints; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## Home Communion in July




