Sometimes the scripture readings for a day seem disconnected or distant. But sometimes, one or more of them will seem to be "ripped from the headlines," as the old saying goes. For this Sunday, the latter statement is true. The Gospel reading is the story of Jesus walking across the water, in a storm, to reach the struggling disciples' boat.

Don't you just wish sometimes, that you could look up and see Jesus walking toward you? When there are "storms" everywhere: politics; weather; economics; family; work; don't you long to see Jesus walking toward you – preferably with an easy answer in hand?

Well, there is Good News and bad news. The bad news is that Jesus may not come to you in a physical body, and he does not come to us with easy answers. But the Good News is that the Son of God, with the Father and the Spirit, is here, as close as your next breath.

When things get tough, when you feel like you're not sure if you've got enough in the tank to make it to the finish line, call on God, through Jesus Christ, in the power of the Spirit. God WILL be there for you.


