From Fr. John

Boy, you talk about your "dog days of summer." Did you know that we have just come out of the longest streak of 100+ degree days, in Alexandria history? It's true. From July 25th through August 11th it was at least 100 degrees every day. And it was 105 or hotter, on multiple days during that streak. Eighteen days of extreme heat – it makes today's 93 degrees feel almost chilly. Almost. This much hot weather just makes people tired and grumpy.

I was sitting in my air conditioned office (after coming to church from my air conditioned home, by way of my air conditioned car), and I was complaining about the heat. I'm sure you've all done the same. Then I started thinking about all those folks who live on the streets. And how hot they must be.

Imagine not having any place where you can sit down – much less lie down – that is cool to the touch. Instead, you hunt for places to rest where you don't burn your skin when contact is made. Those place must be in the shade. And in the downtown area of Alexandria, shade is an elusive commodity.

Now imagine that it is 107 degrees, which it was on August 11th. The best that you, as a houseless person, can hope for is about 102 degrees in one of those moving shady spots. Everything you own is hot, including whatever you have been able to procure to drink. Imagine how tired and grumpy you would be then.

Jesus said, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing ..." (Matthew 25: 34-36a). And I was hot and you cooled me.

Please think about our sisters and brothers who live on the streets, during this heatwave. Help when and where you can. If you don't know how, contact Deacon Michael or Joy Owensby and ask about the H²O program.


