#### From Fr. John

Recently I saw NOAA's hurricane predictions for this season. Thankfully, it is forecast to be an "ordinary" year for storms in the Gulf. That means that we are likely to have 12-17 named storms (i.e. winds in excess of 39 mph). Of those, we can expect 5-9 to develop into hurricanes (winds in excess of 74 mph). I truly give thanks that they are not predicting yet another "active" year for gulf storms. But the possibility of 5 or more hurricanes makes one stop and think, given our experiences of a couple of years ago.

We are currently well into the hurricane season. And with our current drought, we might be tempted to pray for a "little hurricane" to bring some much-needed rain. But now is the time to make sure that we are prepared for whatever weather-related problems we might have this season. Now is the time to take out your hurricane preparedness list and blow the dust off of it. Then make sure that you have what you need to be prepared. But before anything significant enters the Gulf, with a trajectory toward Louisiana, we can *still* pray for rain.

O God, our heavenly Father, who by your Son Jesus Christ has promised to all those who seek your kingdom and its righteousness all things necessary to sustain their life: Send us, we ask, in this time of need, such moderate rain and showers, that we may receive the fruits of the earth, to our comfort and to your honor; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
