Have you seen any of the TV ads that end with a black screen and the words, "He gets us. All of us."? This ad campaign is a way to get Jesus' message to the masses, by means that might break through the defenses of the unchurched and those who have fallen away.

One of the videos, entitled "Love is Louder," is a great example. The images that flash across the screen are of people yelling at each other, pushing each other, punching each other, and otherwise being angry with each other. Then it changes to images of people laughing and playing together, helping each other, and just experiencing joy. Over all of this, is narration that says:

"Hate is loud. It uses all its breath and then some, to shout its selfish causes and to spew its vile venom. It's obsessed with division and distress. With its gain and its success at another one's expense. Hate is loud.

But love ... is louder. It is patient, it is kind. It is gentle, but it is strong. But it is a different kind of sound. It doesn't shout or raise its voice. It's love's whisper that is loud. A whisper like a song or a like the rushing of the wind. It reverberates and resonates and amplifies within. Love is louder.

Jesus loves louder. He gets us. All of us."

When there are wars and rumors of wars all around us. When our nation's leaders cannot stop yelling and sniping at each other long enough to do something constructive for our people, it is important for us to remember that Love is Louder – Jesus' love is louder.

Make some noise for Jesus.

Join us **THIS Saturday**, October 14, from **10:00** a.m. - **noon** to hear the remarkable story of Rev. Avery Hamilton and Mr. Dean Woods, two men from different backgrounds who have come together to honor the legacy of the Colfax Massacre. The massacre, a shocking event in American history that occurred in 1873 in Grant Parish, Louisiana, resulted in the deaths of over 60

Black men who were asserting their constitutional rights. Up until now, it has largely been forgotten in the retelling of our history.

Rev. Avery Hamilton, a Black man and the great-great-great grandson of Jesse McKinney, the first man killed in the massacre, is the pastor of the First Baptist Church in Colfax. He grew up in Colfax without knowing about his family's past or the events that took place there. Dean, a white man in Houston and the great-grandson of Bedford Woods, a man who participated in the massacre, grew up in Louisiana without knowing about his family's connection to the event.

Avery and Dean's talk will highlight how they have worked together to establish the

Colfax Memorial Organization (https://www.colfaxmemorial.org/) to correct a false historical narrative and offer a place of remembrance and reflection. They will also share their vision to continue to make a difference in their community and the world and provide a model of transformation and healing across racial and historical divides.




Adult Christian Formation




HALLOWEEN at ST. JAMES 5:00 - 8:00 PM Church Steps


