As most of you are aware, Donna, Taylor, and I traveled to upstate New York recently. We had a good trip and got to be there for a nephew's wedding. It was a good vacation and we were glad that we got to do it.

When we got back, I had an appointment with my back surgeon in Lafayette. Given all of the testing I've had recently and the non-surgical treatments that had failed, I was expecting her to say that I needed surgery. I was surprised though, when she said that the best procedure she could offer would be a multi-level fusion of my lumbar spine. That was not what I had anticipated at all. But after discussing everything with the surgeon, I believe that she is right. So I am scheduled for surgery on November 15th.

I am working with the Worship Committee, the Vestry, and the staff, to make sure that everything is covered appropriately. I know that I will be out for at least a couple of weeks. After that, I'll ease back into things as I am able.

Please keep Donna, Taylor, and me in your prayers as we all endure yet another spine surgery. Your prayers for my doctors and me are greatly appreciated. But your prayers for Donna and Taylor are really needed – I am not always the best of patients.

Know that even as all of this unfolds, I am here for you if you need me. You have my cell phone number. Never hesitate to call me if you need pastoral care or anything else that I might be able to provide.




HALLOWEEN at ST. JAMES 5:00 - 8:00 PM **Church Steps**



All Saints' Day




