Friday the nation will commemorate Veterans Day, that day on which we celebrate all those who have given of themselves in defense of this country. Last year at this time, Donna and I were talking about Veterans Day. I told her that sometimes I get a bit embarrassed when people find out that I am a veteran and say, "Thank you for your service." You see, when Donna and I were in the service, it was peace-time. We were never asked to make the kind of sacrifices that recent veterans and active duty troops have known.

While we no longer have a "hot war," in Iraq or Afghanistan, as we have for so long; there are still over 45,000 troops stationed in the Middle East. And headlines will tell you that there is not much safety to be found in that region of the world. In other words, even though we are not technically at war right now, the women and men of the military – as well as those whose service has ended – need and deserve our continued prayers. From our Book of Common Prayer, page 823, let us pray:

Amen.




