Merry Christmas (it is still Christmas for two more days) and Happy New Year.

This is an interesting time of year for the Church. We are still talking about Christmas as the society around us has moved on to New Year's Eve and (probably tomorrow) Valentine's Day. Then, when we "finally" stop talking about Christmas, we are in the season of Epiphany, which the surrounding culture seems to care little about, other than some 12<sup>th</sup> Night celebrations. Christmas and Epiphany are decidedly seasons in which the Church is truly countercultural. That's a good thing. Jesus was counter-cultural.

Jesus told us to: feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; welcome the stranger; clothe the naked; care for the sick; and visit those who are shut-in or in prison, not matter who they are. (Matthew 25:35-36) In the world today (or closer to home, on Alexandria, Louisiana today) there is not much that is more counter-cultural than following Jesus' instructions.

Our Church calendar may not match the one for the world around us, but we continue to follow it. Let's also buck societal trends and care for every other human being – even those whom we don't think deserve it. And even those with whom we disagree.
