## From Fr. John

This is the last full week of the season of Epiphany. Although advertisers would have you believe that the most important thing next week is Valentine's Day, this year, the 14<sup>th</sup> of February is Ash Wednesday, the start of the Lenten season and a day of self-denial and repentance. That sets up a clash of cultures.

In America, Valentine's Day is dedicated to romance, typically expressed through the purchase of flowers and/or candy. I readily admit that it seems completely incongruous to me to walk into a shop to purchase flowers or sweet treats with a cross of ashes on my forehead. I cannot tell you how to handle these two days of remembrance which, to my mind, cannot exist in the same space. All I can tell you is, the ARC program that Taylor attends during the week has chosen to pretend that Valentine's Day always falls on February 15<sup>th</sup>, and are having their party on that day. Monday would work even better, because it is ahead of Lent and does not clash with the Shrove Tuesday pancake supper.

I am willing to bet that this year, the number of people who give up chocolate for Lent will be at an all-time low. But how you handle the Valentine's Day/Ash Wednesday conflict is completely up to you. All I suggest is that you give this issue some thought and some prayer time.

Lent is an important season in the life of the Church. It is our time of self-examination. And hopefully our time of honestly evaluating our lives as Christians. It is a time of repentance and turning back toward the God to whom we owe our very lives. It is the yearly time to truly prepare ourselves in order to fully embrace the wonder of Easter. And Ash Wednesday is an important part of our having a Holy Lent.

Because I believe that Ash Wednesday is such an important day in our lives, the church office will be closed next Wednesday. Our Eucharist services, with imposition of Ashes will be at: 7:00am; 12:15pm; and 5:15pm.






## **Lenten Resources Available**
