From Fr. John

Happy Mardi Gras to you all. Although our weather caused the cancellation of some events, Mardi Gras in Louisiana will always be Mardi Gras. Louisianans will always find a way to "Laissez le bon temps rouler!" So, enjoy your Fat Tuesday (the English translation of the French, Mardi Gras). And come by the church tonight for the annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. Because tomorrow, our Lenten observance begins.

As our Book of Common Prayer reminds us, Ash Wednesday is the day on which we are "put in mind of the message of pardon and absolution set forth in the Gospel our Savior, and of the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith." We have blessed ashes put on our foreheads as a visible reminder of those things.

And every year, after the service, the question comes up: Should I wash the ashes off my forehead before going back out into the world? The short answer is, it is up to you. If the ashes will be a continual reminder for the rest of the day, leave them. If the ashes will be a hindrance to you for the rest of the day, wash them off. The only "shouldn't" in all of this is: Don't keep ashes on your forehead in order to let the rest of the world know that you are a super pious Christian. That defeats the purpose of repentance.

Ashes are a reminder of who we are, and whose we are. And we can all use a reminder of those things. Keep them or don't. But please make the time to come to St. James (7:00am, 12:15pm, or 5:15pm) to hear the Word of God, to receive ashes, and to be fed by Body and Blood. The worship and reminders are good for us all.

May you all have a Holy and Blessed Lent, Fr. John+


beverage, and sit in. There is no preparation needed to join in the discussion.
